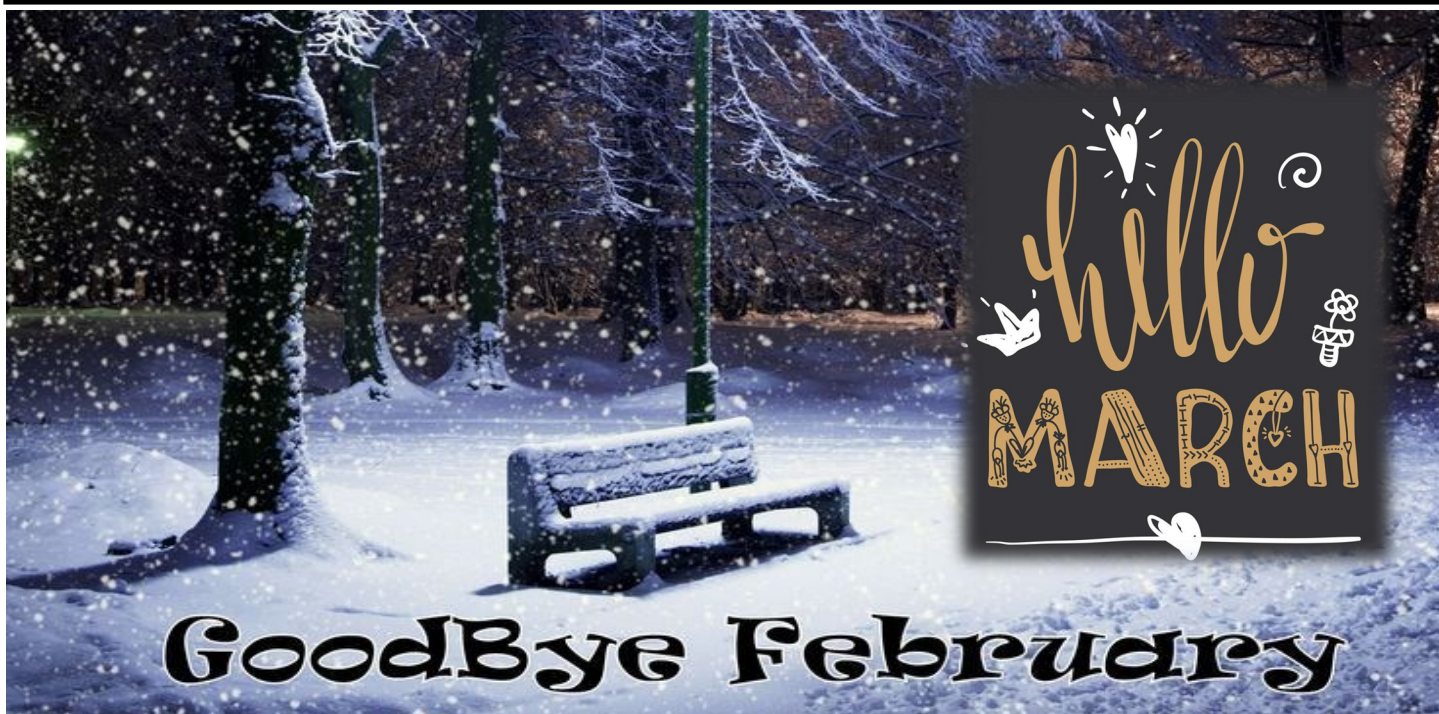

Parents must commit to all sessions, with session 1 mandatory. The seven-week program consists of five in-person sessions and two sessions conducted by phone. In-person sessions are March 17, 24, 31, April 7, 28, 2022.

Parents will receive support to help manage their teen's behaviour and prevent the problems that makes family life stressful.

We start with developing positive relationship between parents and child, then share ideas how we can increase desirable behaviour, teach new skills and behaviours, manage misbehaviour, and finally deal with risky behaviour.
