December 6th and 7th we went to Sturgis for a 4 team tournament. On Friday we defeated Sturgis 48-21, and on Saturday we defeated Yorkdale 'A-Team' 36-32, Yorkdale B team 38-26 and lost in overtime to Yorkdale 'A team' 44-41.

On Monday, December 16th we played host to Preeceville and lost 58-40.

Our boys lost 82-58 to Porcupine Plain on Friday before defeating Stoughton Saturday a.m., and then losing to Norquay Saturday p.m. They will play host to Kamsack on Thursday, January 23rd before going to Middle Lake on the 24th and 25th and then to Norquay on January 31st and February 1st, then to Langenburg on February 7th and 8th.










Grade 10 students sat in History 10 watching a neighbour across the street and immediately wanted to help with the large amount of snow. So they chose to do a good deed.
