What to do if you find a needle in the community

Needles (sharps) are items that may be contaminated with body fluids, such as blood, and can puncture or cut skin.

Children should NOT TOUCH the needle and should show an adult where it is.

Do NOT try to put the cap back on.



- Place a sharps pail or hard plastic container on the ground, <u>do not</u> hold it
- Pick the needle up carefully by the end that is not sharp.
 Use tongs, pliers, tweezers, or a gloved hand.
- Once in container, cap with lid, label and tape shut.
- Wash hands or clean with hand sanitizer.

Do NOT place used needles in the garbage or recycling!





I've been poked by a used needle! NOW WHAT?

- Stay calm. Risk of infection from tetanus, hepatitis B, hepatitis C, and HIV is very low.
- Let the wound bleed freely. **Do not** squeeze, suck, scrub or rub the wound.
- 3. Wash wound with soap and water right away.
- 4. See a health care provider right away.
