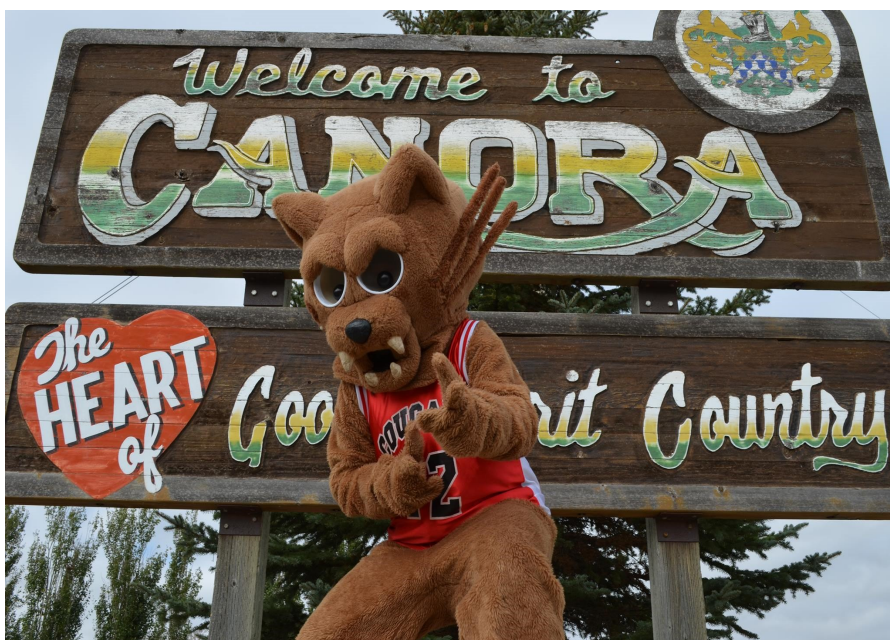

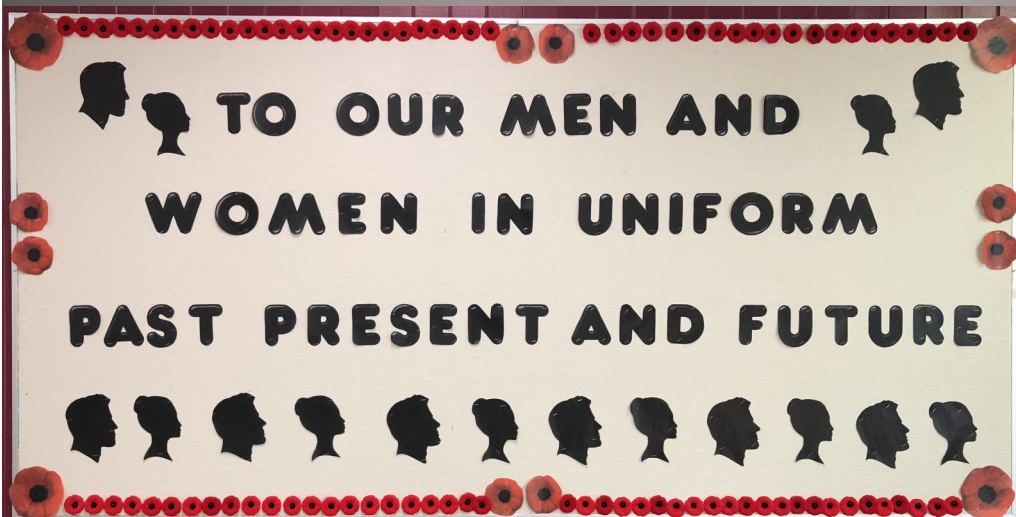


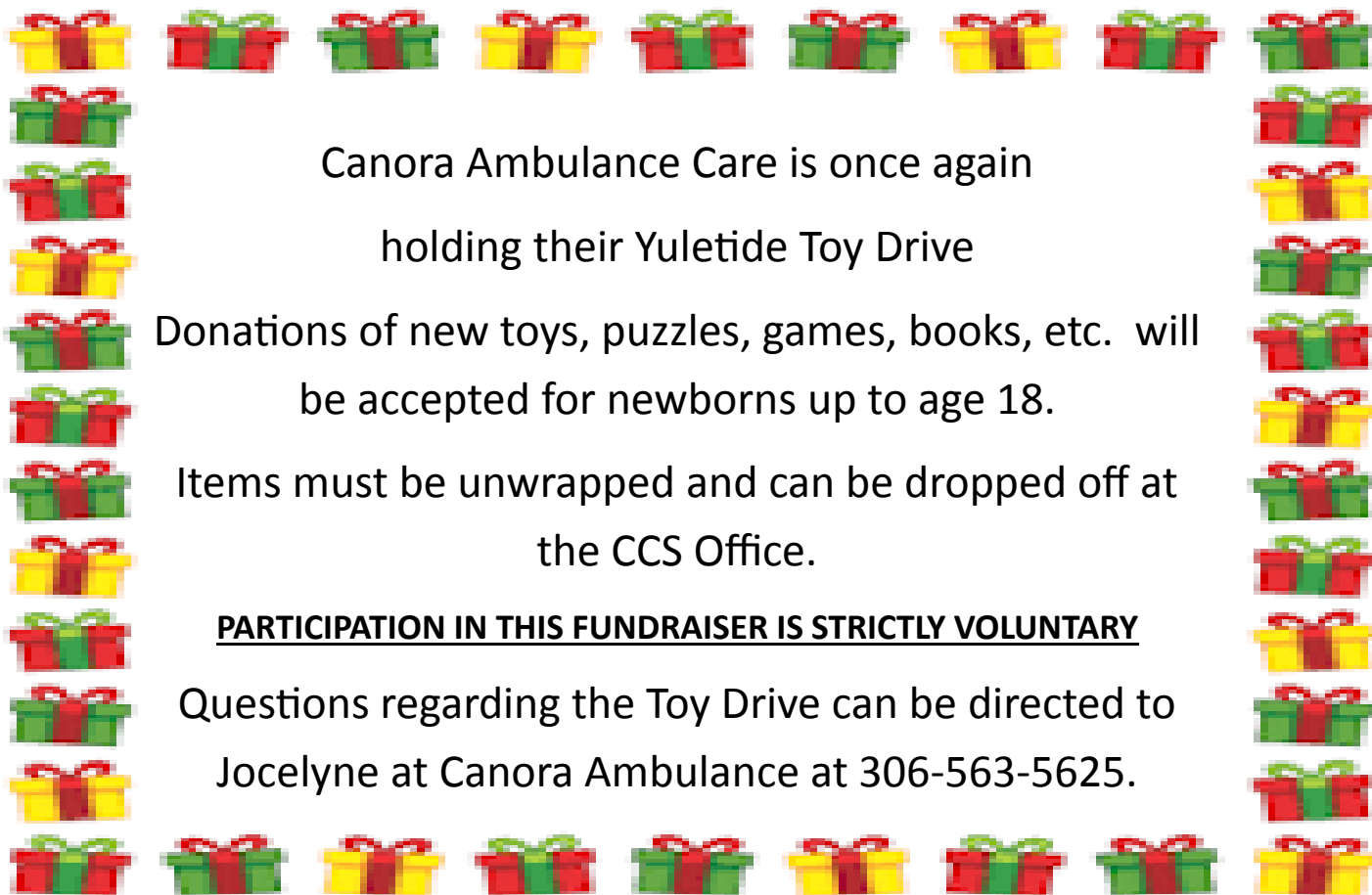
The Grade 12's won that challenge and were presented the items by Alfredo Converso.

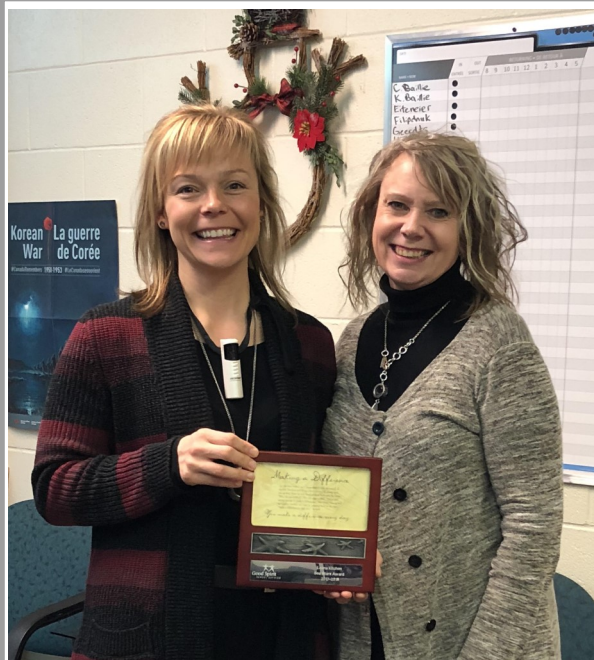
