CCS is very proud to highlight Jack Craig on his accomplishment with SMEA Saskatchewan Music Educators Association!

He performed with the Saskatchewan Provincial Honour band in Saskatoon. Mr. Sehgers stated, "This is a major accomplishment, as it required a rigorous audition, and only 60 student were selected from their blind audition throughout the entire province. This event is the equivalent of making provincials/hoopla for band."

The Saskatchewan Junior and Intermediate Honour Band South Program provides an enrichment experience for exceptional band students from across Southern Saskatchewan. It is offered as a joint project between the Saskatchewan Band Association and the Saskatchewan Music Educators Association.

Auditions for Honour band happen in the spring and are anonymous. Students are selected for honour band based on their audition recordings. After students are selected, they are given the music selections to practice all summer and into the fall until they meet and perform together in concert where they are coached by world-class conductors and composers. This year, Sasaktchewan Provincial Honour band was held in person for the first time since COVID and was held in Saskatoon on November 3rd, 4th, & 5th.
